



WHAT YOU NEED

USER GUIDE LEATHER MILK FURNITURE CONDITIONER NO. 5

BEFORE YOU START MAKE SURE YOU ARE PREPARED

- Make sure your leather furniture is dry, clean and free of dust, dirt or grease before using Leather Milk Furniture Conditioner No. 5.
- Test the solution on a small, discreet area of your leather, even if you have applied the No. 5 to other leather furniture with success. Each piece of leather can react differently to a conditioner.
- Treat the leather furniture in an outdoor or well-ventilated environment. Though the No. 5 contains UV protectors, it is advisable to avoid deliberate exposure to direct and heavy sunlight.

METHOD

1 Pour the conditioner onto the applicator pad and gently massage the conditioner evenly across leather surface. Uneven spread may lead to splotchy dry. Use thin layers, giving leather as many coats as it needs, but only as much conditioner as it can absorb.

2 When done, leave it to dry naturally. Do not apply heat or speed-drying.

3 Buff off any excess or remaining conditioner. For best results, allow your leather furniture to dry overnight and before sitting or lying on it.

PRECAUTIONARY NOTE

- Although this solution contains UV protectors, it does not mean the leather furniture should be exposed under the sun for drying.
- Keep the Leather Milk solution out of reach of children and away from extreme temperature.
- Do not allow the solution to get into the eyes or be consumed internally.
- Do not use your treated item until it is totally dry to avoid any possibility of skin irritation or stain on your skin or clothing.
- Always wash your hands with soap and water after use and before touching eyes or consuming food with your hands.
- Not for use on suede or extremely soft leather types like aniline leather. Works best on semi-aniline leather and pigmented leather. Do not use this product if you have nut-allergy.

REMEMBER

1 Always conduct a patch test on an inconspicuous area of your item to ensure that the product is suitable for use before proceeding further. It is especially important to test any leather treatment before using it on vegetable tanned, aniline, semi-aniline, or lighter colored leathers.

2 The surface of the treated item may look darker when you first treated it. It should lighten up when it is completely dry.

3 Read the manufacturer's tags or instructions before applying any treatment or solution to your item to ensure maximum protection and adherence.
